# INTRODUCTION

Gender Sensitisation is a broad concept to cover the entire gamut of spreading awareness on Gender Equality in the true sense of the term. It is important to understand gender relations, and gender mainstreaming in order to find out the obstacles in making the organisation gender friendly. Once we get to know the obstacles it becomes easier to understand the Essential Features to make an organisation gender-sensitive and achieve gender equality.

So far the trend of training or capacity building on the issue has been to familiarize the women officials and staff on what constitutes sexual harassment in the workplace and how they can approach the organisation or the Committee constituted as per the guidelines of Vishakha Committee (The Vishaka Guidelines were a set of procedural guidelines for use in India in cases of sexual harassment. They were promulgated by the Indian Supreme Court in 1997 and were superseded in 2013 by the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace "Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal" Act, 2013.)

Now a fresh look has been attempted by the government to deal with issue by recommending a course on Gender Sensitisation of men and women alike. The idea is familiarise and sensitise the men also as to what behaviour of theirs would constitute sexual harassment in workplace. At the same time both men and women are equally to be made aware of the equality of opportunities with respect and dignity in the workplace. In a way, Gender Equality should become a priority not only in the Organisation Mission Statement, general objectives and policies but also in the recuitment process.
