#### **About CPS**

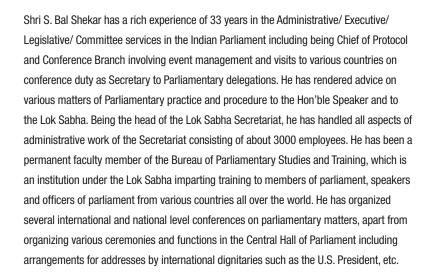
