IACA Signs MoU with PARI Training Institute to Strengthen Long-Term Cooperation

Our collaboration with PARI demonstrates how international expertise and national leadership can come together to strengthen institutional resilience. Through this partnership, we aim to support sustainable capacity-building efforts that reinforce ethical governance and long-term integrity systems."

The MoU was signed in the margins of the Tailor-Made Leadership Training Programme on Anti-Corruption and Good Governance in the Era of AI, delivered at IACA's premises in Laxenburg, Austria, from 23 to 27 February 2026.

The partnership between IACA and PARI Training Institute started in 2021 with the joint planning and design of tailor-made training programmes, which began to be delivered in 2024. So far, four batches of specialized Anti-Corruption and Good Governance training programmes have been implemented by both institutions, benefiting more than 40 senior and mid-level government officers drawn from across the spectrum of India's public institutions spanning Central Government Ministries, State Governments, and Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs).

During the last training, over the course of five days, the participants engaged in in-depth discussions on corruption and electronic evidence, examined the growing role of artificial intelligence in preventing and detecting corruption risks, and explored complex issues related to public procurement and ethical decision-making. The sessions combined academic expertise with practical insights and interactive exchanges, fostering meaningful dialogue and peer learning. The programme also included a visit to the Vienna International Centre, offering participants an additional perspective on international anti-corruption efforts and multilateral cooperation.

He has an MBA from Southern Cross University in Lismore, Australia. He mainly served in Manipur before coming to Delhi on Central Deputation to serve as a PS to a Central Minister and later worked in the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare as Deputy Secretary and Director. He served as Director of Vigilance-cum-Joint Commissioner of Police in the Anti-corruption Cell, Govt. of NCT Delhi from 1994-2000. He also held additional charge of CVO in Delhi Electric Supply Undertaking and Labour Commissioner in the Govt. of NCT Delhi. Shri Shrivastava worked as Secretary of Services and Administrative Reforms in the Delhi Govt., Chief Secretary of Goa and Chief Secretary, Govt. of Delhi, Vice Chairman, of Delhi Development Authority, and Secretary of coordination, Security, and Public Grievances, Govt. of India. Last but not least he worked as State Election Commissioner of Delhi and Chandigarh from 2016 to 2022.

Vytenis BENETIS is the Director of i-intelligence in Asia. Vytenis has worked as an intelligence analyst for a decade. His professional experience covers a wide range of missions and organizations including the Lithuanian Ministry of Defence, NATO, and the European Union on both the operational and strategic level. While working as an analyst, and later as a team leader, Vytenis developed practical solutions to tackling large information flows and delivering actionable intelligence to senior decision makers. Vytenis has an extensive engineering academic background: he holds B.Sc. degree in Systems Engineering from the U.S. Naval Academy and PhD in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Maryland. Since joining i-intelligence, Vytenis has provided research, training, and advisory services to public and private sector clients across Asia. His mandates have spanned a range of intelligence disciplines including criminal intelligence, cyber intelligence, fraud investigations, counterterrorism and general open source and social media investigations.
