ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

Rooted in the Constitution of India and governed by established rules of procedure and conventions, Parliament operates as the central institution of democratic governance, ensuring accountability of the Executive to the Legislature. An understanding of these foundational principles is essential for appreciating how legislative business is conducted, how oversight is exercised, and how institutional balance is maintained within India's parliamentary democracy.

Designed for senior and mid-level government officers, the programme equips participants with the knowledge to effectively engage with parliamentary mechanisms, respond to parliamentary questions and assurances, and

understand the constitutional framework underpinning India's parliamentary democracy.

Officers in ministries, departments, PSUs, and autonomous bodies under the Central Government are regularly called upon to brief ministers, respond to Parliament, host Parliamentary Committees, and prepare for scrutiny by the PAC and CAG — often without formal training in parliamentary practice and procedure.
