In this context, structured capacity-building and specialised training programmes are not merely developmental initiatives but essential instruments for ensuring legal compliance, safeguarding organisational reputation, and fostering a culture of ethical leadership.

Participation in such programmes enables private sector organisations to equip their executives with the requisite knowledge, global best practices, and practical tools necessary to navigate complex regulatory expectations and contribute meaningfully to a transparent, accountable, and corruption-resilient business environment.

The MoU was signed in the margins of the *Tailor-Made Leadership Training Programme on Anti-Corruption and Good Governance in the Era of AI*, delivered at IACA’s premises in Laxenburg, Austria, from 23 to 27 February 2026.

The partnership between IACA and PARI Training Institute started in 2021 with the joint planning and design of tailor-made training programmes, which began to be delivered in 2024. 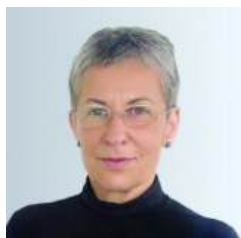

It is a Turnkey Programme and therefore, the Participants can travel on Blue Passport (Personal passport) which should have the validity of at least 3 months from the date of arrival in Austria. The Diplomatic Passport holders do not need a visa to enter Austria, hence they need not apply for a visa.
